I hope you and your families are doing well and have been enjoying the summer. It has been great hearing your concerns and feedback, and I am excited about much of the work our government is doing to serve you!

#### 2024 COMMUNITY BBQ

It was great seeing you all at our annual Community BBQ! There is no question that one of the highlights of my summer was our annual Community BBQ at Canmore Park. I am grateful to each and every one of you who dropped by as well as my amazing volunteers who made it all possible. It means a lot when we come together as a community!



#### AUTOMATIC LICENSE RENEWALS

Our government has introduced automatic license plate renewals, 90 days before expiry for vehicle owners that have valid insurance and no outstanding fines or tolls. After our government eliminated the sticker fees in 2022, saving you \$120 per year for each car, we heard your concerns about how easy it would be to forget to renew. That is why we are taking the burden off of you and saving you time!

### ACCELERATING CONSTRUCTION ON THE GARDINER EXPRESSWAY

Our government is helping to accelerate construction on the Gardiner Expressway by at least one year by providing up to \$73 million to the City of Toronto on the condition that work may be allowed to proceed on a 24/7 basis.

I know how many residents in Scarborough - Rouge Park rely on the Gardiner Expressway each day, which is why we are doing our part to get you out of gridlock and where you need to go faster.

#### INVESTING IN THE JOINT AIR SUPPORT UNIT TO FIGHT AUTO THEFT

These helicopters will be equipped with the latest technology and will help keep highways and roadways safe from violent carjacking's, auto theft, street racing, and impaired driving.

#### Dear Neighbours,

It was great seeing so many of you at community events this past summer and fall. Thank you to everyone who joined us at our second annual Harvest Fest at the Port Union Community Centre and our two Community Environment Days—your attendance and participation are what make these events so special. I look forward to next year.

#### IMPROVING PORT UNION ROAD

The Port Union Road Improvements Project will enhance travel and road safety along Port Union Road for all road users. It will widen the road to provide two traffic lanes in each direction, add raised cycle tracks and create sidewalks on both sides.

To date, the project has:

• Completed the retaining wall construction on the west side of Port Union Road, north and south of Rozell Road, and at Adam's Creek on the west side of Port Union Road.

• Laid underground conduits for new streetlights on the east side of Port Union Road

Construction into December is focused on reconstructing the west side of Port Union Road from Island Road to Lawrence Avenue East. To advance the construction schedule, pending weather conditions through winter, the contractor is planning to carry out work on retaining walls on the east side of Port Union Road as well as underground electrical work.

Road work will begin on the east side of Port Union Road in early spring 2025.

### REOPENING WATERFRONT TRAIL WEST OF HIGHLAND CREEK

To protect the Waterfront Trail and shoreline from erosion, the Toronto and Region Conservation Authority has made improvements to the Waterfront Trail over the past few years.

The portion of the trail west of Highland Creek reopened in June. The trail in this area was washed out and dangerous. The Toronto and Region Conservation Authority elevated the trail and added a beach curb to protect the trail from erosion while allowing people to enjoy the waterfront.

Thank you to the Toronto and Region Conservation Authority staff for their hard work protecting our natural spaces and keeping them beautiful.

#### **311 AT YOUR SERVICE**

311 connects clients to non-emergency City services, programs and information.

The service can be accessed 24/7 by calling 311, visiting toronto.ca/311 or using the 311 Toronto mobile app.

You can use 311 to create service requests for animal control, bylaw violations, property standards, graffiti, missed solid waste pickup, tree pruning requests or to report litter and illegal dumping. Potholes can also be reported to 311.

When submitting a service request, provide as much information as possible including location, description, photos and your contact information.

You will receive a reference number. Please record it so your request can be tracked. This number allows you to check the status of and edit or cancel your request.

If your request has not been handled in an appropriate timeframe, please follow up with my office.

Dear West Rouge residents,

I hope you had a relaxing summer with family, friends, and neighbours. As I return to Parliament in September, I want to extend my heartfelt thanks to everyone who has shared their concerns and hopes for our community and country.

#### **PROGRESS AGAINST AUTO THEFT:**

The federal government continues to use every tool at its disposal to crack down on auto theft in partnership with provinces, manufacturers, shippers, and law enforcement. Over the past six months, auto thefts have fallen by 17% nationwide and by 14% in Ontario. While this early progress is encouraging, we remain committed to significantly reducing these numbers as we keep Canadians and their property safe.

\$28 million to the Canada Border Services Agency to ensure they can scan outbound rail and shipping containers for stolen cars.

#### MORE CANADIANS RECEIVING DENTAL CARE:

We are delivering on our promise to help more Canadians access dental care and make life more affordable for families, seniors, and children. As of early August, nearly 450,000 Canadians have received dental care, and 2.3 million have been approved for coverage under the Canadian Dental Care Plan (CDCP). This includes seniors aged 65 and above, children under 18, and adults with a valid Disability Tax Credit certificate.

All remaining eligible Canadians will be invited to join the CDCP in 2025.

Tougher criminal penalties for auto theft offences and cracking down on the sale, possession, distribution, and import of devices commonly used to steal cars.

New scanning tools and enhancements to the CBSA's antismuggling efforts, including the deployment of a mobile X-ray scanner in the GTA. These improvements have already led to the interception of 1,205 stolen vehicles in railyards and ports across Canada as of May 20, 2024.

\$121 million to Ontario police services to help them disrupt, dismantle, and prosecute the organized crime groups involved in auto theft.

#### FINDING A CDCP PROVIDER NEAR YOU:

We understand how important it is for patients to continue seeing their family dentist or a provider close to home. That's why we are working hard to sign up more oral health professionals. So far, nearly 19,000 oral health professionals — about 75% — are participating in the CDCP, with more joining every day.

#### **INVESTING IN OUR YOUTH:**

Last month, I had the privilege of meeting Canada Summer Jobs students working at businesses and organizations in Scarborough—Rouge Park. Whether it was their first job or a role related to their career goals, these students took real ownership of their work, gaining valuable new experiences, skills, and friends. Some of the students were even offered full-time positions beyond the summer months!

This year's rollout created 70,000 jobs, including 254 in our community. Budget 2024 will build on this success by creating 90,000 youth jobs through a \$351.2 million investment in

Canada Summer Jobs and the Youth Employment and Skills Strategy.

#### **TEAM CANADA SHINES AT PARIS 2024:**

From record-breaking performances to heart-stopping finishes, Canada's Olympic athletes have once again triumphed on the world stage. Team Canada took home a historic 27 medals — 9 gold, 7 silver, and 11 bronze — its highest-ever medal count in a non-boycotted Olympics. With the Paralympics underway, there's even more excitement ahead as our athletes continue to make us proud!

## Do you know your neighbours?

Welcome to West Rouge, "Uncle Kev"!

That's what the kids call Kevin Carrington, their coach and inspiration to make right choices. To his radio listeners, he is known as "The Voice", and when you hear him speak, you'll know why!

Kevin Carrington moved here just a year ago with his wife and four kids. He recalls being a Scarborough kid who was forced to move from his neighbourhood to Markham. While growing up in Markham, almost forty years ago, he remembers him and his sister being the only two coloured kids in a school of three hundred and fifty. He faced some challenges here. His father was the traditional parent who grew up in a time when "kids were to be seen, and not heard". He was also told not to rock the boat or cause any controversy. Kevin learned to fit in, but



repressed his emotions and grew up with a strong temper. He had a teacher who took him aside and explained that school was all about rules and following instructions. At this point, he was at a crossroads; he had a spiritual awakening, and made some tough choices. It was between angrier and getting angrier, or channeling that energy into something constructive, creative and positive. He vowed to never be like his dad, but he had this "aha" moment when he

Change was not overnight, but in baby steps, and small daily wins. Kevin shared that it was not easy, and he would mindfully weigh the consequences of making reactive emotional decisions, and was able to change his focus from himself to others. How could he help and impact others to make better choices to build lives and move forward in life while helping himself? Progress, satisfaction and fulfilment came in bits and pieces as he made these tough decisions daily. In this journey, he realized how vital overall health is and looked at himself holistically. He watched what he did with his time, what he ate, what he learned and was able to make quite a breakthrough in his own life and the lives of others. The rest is history!

He creatively handles traffic, sports and sometimes, the weather at CBC. As a registered vendor with the TDSB, he promotes Caribbean culture and fitness through his reggae-inspired program called, "Reggaecise".

He addresses topics like racism, equity and anti-oppression with students through music and dance. He loves the arts and emcees in cultural and other events all across the city, Kevin keeps himself physically, mentally and financially fit with active sports and staying within budgets financially.

He is a very caring person, with a beautiful family of two sons, two daughters and his wife. Markhams's loss is West Rouge's gain. I asked him what was his motivation to keep going and here's what he said, "I can come home to my family and have the ability to impact others in my community by sharing my life's journey to make a difference. This is what keeps me going."

Here's wishing him and his family great success in the best place to live in Toronto!

5 works of fiction set close to home

One of my favourite parts of teaching Canadian literature at the University of Toronto is highlighting the impactful and incredibly diverse stories coming out of Scarborough, where I spent most of my childhood jumping between Toronto Public Library branches. From the Rouge Valley to the end of the LRT (may it rest in peace), if you're looking for books to add to your fall reading list, you can start right at home with these great titles.

#### Scarborough by Catherine Hernandez (Arsenal Pulp Press)

This novel from 2017 put Scarborough literature on the map. Set in a Rouge Hill literacy centre, Hernandez skillfully captures the triumphs and heartbreaks of a close-knit community impacted by the challenges present in their low-income

neighbourhood. The film adaptation of this book also picked up several Canadian Screen Awards and is currently available to watch on CBC Gem.

#### **Shut Up You're Pretty by Téa Mutonji** (Arsenal Pulp Press)

This award-winning collection of short stories recently took the country by storm on CBC's Canada Reads. Written during Mutonji's undergrad at UTSC and published through VS Books, Arsenal's series dedicated to emerging

writers of colour, these interconnected vignettes follow a young girl from the Congo as she comes of age in Galloway, Scarborough. Mutonji's prose is precise and provocative and marks the debut of a literary talent.

#### Much Ado About Nada by Uzma Jalaluddin (HarperCollins Canada)

Take Jane Austen's Persuasion, set it in a fictional Scarborough-esque community, and reunite the leads at a Muslim conference full of hijinks and drama – it's the perfect stage for an unforgettable second chance romance. Like Austen,





#### That Time I Loved You by Carrianne Leung (HarperCollins Canada)



10 years to emerge and captures the resilience and tenderness of a misrepresented neighbourhood.

If you've finished these Scarborough classics, and are looking for something new, my debut novel Never Been Better released with HarperCollins, follows three friends who meet in a Scarborough mental health centre and find themselves coming to terms with love and recovery at a picture-perfect destination wedding a year later.

Throughout my writing journey, I have been lucky to have been guided by the authors on this list. There are so many stories still to be told across Scarborough, and hopefully the success of their books help make room for many more.



## Sugar Mother Nature's Antifreeze

Why do you like kale better in the winter than in the summer? Because it's sweeter! Kale will grow in the winter in many areas, you don't actually plant it during the winter if you want to harvest it then. In the winter the plant moves its sugars to the leaves to keep it from freezing. Sugar is a natural antifreeze. Water freezes at 0 degrees Celsius. But if you put sugar in water,



it freezes at -10 degrees Celsius. A good example from Mother Nature is maple syrup. When the sap runs from a maple tree in the spring, you can lick it right off the snow. That's because it's approximately 66% sugar!

Another example is the antifreeze in your car. Sometimes you see green stuff on the pavement, and if you were to dip your finger in it, it would taste sweet! In fact, many dogs die each year because they drink the antifreeze that gets spilled when people fill their car in the driveway. Dogs don't know it's poisonous, they just know it's sweet!

With kale, carrots and other vegetables that continue to grow in the winter, they stay alive in the snow and the sugar in the leaves prevents them from freezing. That's Mother Nature's antifreeze – sugar – at work!

So, the next time you are looking for something sweet in the winter, have a peek in your garden and see what's still growing – you might discover a sweet new treat!

It is humbling when you realize where we started, and how many firsts we have celebrated here! We were the first zoo in the world to be arranged geographically instead of by species. We were the first zoo in Canada to hire a full-time animal nutritionist and a full-time reproductive biologist.

We have continued to push what a world class accredited zoo needs to look like over the past decade, with our state-of-the-art Wildlife Health Centre allowing guests to observe examinations, procedures, and surgeries performed by our dedicated team and valued healthcare partners. This facility enhances our role as a centre of excellence in animal care, leading the industry in reproductive science, veterinary care, nutrition physiology, and overall excellence in animal welfare.

I encourage everyone to reflect on our journey and share that we are so grateful for how you have helped us arrive at today. There is no question we are proud of our accomplishments since your Toronto Zoo opened in 1974. One of the most significant wins has to be hosting over 60 million guests from our community and across the world, and connecting them to our mission of saving wildlife. This personal link is critical as I believe conservation is a team sport, and we need more players. By reaching out, evolving and being innovative, we create new opportunities to deepen our connections with players from all our communities, inspiring them to take action for nature.

Through revolutionary wildlife research projects and deep connections, we are uniquely positioned to make meaningful advancements in conservation science and animal wellbeing, benefitting the individuals in our care and having a global impact.

The Zoo's science journey over the past 50 years focused on our strength in the animal health sciences (veterinary, nutrition, reproduction and welfare



sciences) – fostered through original research and higher education programs with our academic and government partners across Canada and beyond. Building on this incredible foundation, we will expand that reach and impact.

This anniversary is about honouring the past and building a better future for wildlife, our community, and the next generation of wildlife conservation scientists, engaging and empowering them to become Guardians of Wild.

The conservation landscape in 2024 continues to change and challenge us: the dual crises of biodiversity loss and climate change are inspiring the global community to take a deeper look at the relationship between humans and nature. The opening of our Community Conservation Centre in the near future will answer this call and anchor the next phase of conservation science at your Toronto Zoo. This will have us focus on interconnected systems (animals/ plants – people – nature) and ensure we bridge the expertise and knowledge gained from Toronto Zoo's living systems with wild initiatives locally and nationally to accelerate conservation impact.

From the West Rouge Community Flyer, Fall 1989



Some issues never seem to go away, such as traffic & speeding and crime & safety.

But other issues change with the times. Take a look at the Fall 1989 issue of the West Rouge Community Flyer where a topof-mind issue was the need for a pay phone near Rouge Beach Park, which Bell Canada agreed to do.

### TRANSPORTATION & COMMUNICATIONS

Several residents have asked that a phone booth be located near Rouge Beach Park in case of emergency.. It was noted that the nearest pay phone is located at the Rouge Hill Go Station. After several chats with officials at Bell Canada, I am happy to report that a phone booth will be installed at the entrance to the park before Christmas. Residents should note that the reason we had the previous pay phone removed was because it was vandalized so often. Bell officials told me that if this phone is vandalized with any frequency, it will be removed PERMANENTLY. Please report anyone you see destroying this, or any other local amenity, to the police or other authority. If we want these privileges we will have to work to keep them.

Residents have also commented on the traffic congestion at several local intersections, especially Port Union Road and Highway 2, and Port Union Road and Island Road. Requests to improve the traffic flow by changing the traffic signals at these intersections have been made by WRCA and Ward 9 Councillor, Ron Moeser. The Metro Roads and Traffic Department is investigating their feasibility.


## The Rouge Butterflyway

I was always interested in gardening, but it wasn't until our Rouge Butterflyway Ranger, Karen Heisz, wrote an article in our Community Newspaper asking if there were others within the community interested in learning about and growing native plants that I submitted my interest in volunteering and eagerly waited for a response. It didn't take long for Karen to respond, and soon, she had a small group of volunteers. We officially became the Rouge Butterflyway in the fall of 2021.

Using the David Suzuki Butterflyway Program as a guide, we quickly adopted the Sir Oliver Mowat Collegiate garden and the next year we added the Tony Stacey Veterans Center gardens. In 2022, we attended our first Earth Day Event held at the Port Union Community Center. In our butterfly wings and hair bands, we shared stickers, photos, and our passion for native plants; we also offered a demonstration on "How to test your garden soil, showing those in attendance how to become a "Dirt Nerd!" We sold a selection of single native plants as well as a full sun kit and a shade-loving native plant kit. We had a ball at this event and were thrilled with the success of the plant sale; we have participated in this Earth Day Event every year since. We use the funds from our Earth Day Native Plant sale to look after the two gardens that we have adopted. In 2023, we were invited to have a table at the Port Union's Seniors Market. We used this event as an opportunity to educate visitors about Native Plants, and the benefits of growing Native Plants in your gardens. This year we also sold seedlings from our own gardens. The funds from this year's event also went toward the upkeep of our adopted gardens.

We have been busy this summer reviewing designs, moving and transplanting plants in the Tony Stacey Center gardens.

There are now **165 gardens** in the Rouge Butterflyway. Thank you so much for your participation in the David Suzuki Foundation's Butterflyway program!

These gardens will attract pollinators and wildlife, and will make the area more enjoyable for the residents of the Center. In the fall, we hope to start creating our final design. It's exciting, but we have to remember to be patient and practice the mantra of all gardeners - "Start small, dream BIG."
